Bob spoke of the importance of being prepared when you go out to a site and to document what you find. He noted that there are a number of web sites and forms one can access to gain further information and obtain forms. Bob also talked about the use of GPS units to chart the location of finds and said that archeology is all about patterns. Work with Archeological Scan:
