Our program for March will be presented by Clint McKenzie, who has served as the Chairman of the South Texas Archeological Association. Mr. McKenzie has worked with the City of San Antonio on a number of interesting excavations and will share some of his experiences in working in this field.

At each meeting, finds are displayed by category. Members earn points for entering finds and more points for winning in a category. The rules and entry form are available at each regular meeting. Remember, items found since the last meeting until the upcoming meeting may be entered in the **March** Find of the Month contest. You may still show your finds even if you do not wish to compete in the Find of the Month.

February Meeting:

Our own Larry Vickers presented a program about search coils. Larry brought in a number of coils to show as examples and explained how each kind/type of coil operates and what they are best used for when searching. He used a black board to illustrate the coils and search field and how they pick up target signals. There were a number of relevant questions from the audience, and I think everyone gained a better understanding of the uses and limitations of coils.

Club Activities:

Gulf Texas - Several club members met down at the ghost town of Gulf Texas for a two day hunt on Feb. 11 and 12. In spite the wind and cold, the hunters braved the conditions and located a variety of remarkable targets – including old coins i.e. standing liberty quarter, half, some Indian Head cents, buffalo nickels etc. Also found were trade tokens and an old French sword. This hunt was arranged by Bill Fogelsanger who was able to obtain permission to hunt from the owner of the property.

Spicewood Archeological Hunt - We had a great turnout on Saturday, March 4 for the archeological hunt project at the old homestead in Spicewood. We hunted in three designated areas and flagged targets according to signal – iron, mid –range and high range (coins, silver etc.). We later dug the targets and ID'ed and bagged the ones of significance. This hunt was organized by Bob Wishoff, who has done extensive work and research in archeology as well as the Spicewood area. Finds will be donated and put in a display at the future Spicewood library.
