# **July Meeting Program**

Scott Hegel is what you might call an avid water metal detectorist. This was gleaned from his presentation at the July AMDC meeting. At a previous meeting we heard a program on going deep under water, but Scott's program focused on detecting beaches down to about waist deep.



Scott mentioned that many if not most metal detectors worth their salt, have at least a waterproof coil and you should be safe searching in knee deep waters. However, the control box, or the brains of most detectors are not and if your detector slips out of your hand while in the water, bzzt! You can buy a completely submersible detector, however, they usually cost a bit more, but you may be able to go down several feet. However, you might need to buy special earphones in order to hear the tones of the detector. (These 'howevers' are getting expensive!) You can also purchase a handheld submersible detector that lets you down several dozen feet, but now you need air, so let's stick closer to the surface.

Beach hunting generally includes the dry sand and wading into ankle and



Those too can get expensive as Scott has found out over the years whenever he upgraded from one sand scoop to the next. But with each new scoop, he said he would always attach a magnet to the bottom of the scoop. That way any ferrous items would be easily snagged and retrievable.

One specialty item that he built was a floating silt sifter which is made from PVC and pool noodles inside a mesh laundry bag. This can float next to you and allow you to sift your scoops of sand and silt in a bigger space then trying to fish out your finds in the sand scoop.





**The Result:** Scott took this challenge on and looked in the back yard with no luck. The determination was that it was likely in the house.
