Metal Detecting News:

Metal detectorist strikes gold after finding rare Roman coin in field.

A gold Roman coin believed to be the first of its kind ever found in Britain is set to fetch thousands at auction after being unearthed by a metal detectorist. Ron Walters, 76, finally struck gold after six years of searching the same farmer's field near Dudley, West Mids., last May.

The retired welder said he stumbled across the rare Roman coin - which dates back to 69AD after being told by his wife to "bugger off out

for a bit".

It is believed to be the first gold aureus of emperor Aulus Vitellius to be recorded as a find in the British Isles and they can be worth as much as £50,000.

The 1,955-year-old coin was then sent to the British Museum, disclaimed and returned to Ron who contacted auctioneers to organise its sale.
